### APOLLO EIGHT - 8 DEC 24 1968

<u>In December of 1968 - APOLLO 8</u> – may have been the most jaw-dropping scientific space mission that man had ever achieved. History was being made in a more farfetching way than ever before. This spacecraft mission would change the way mankind thinks about space pursuits forever.

In my estimation - one of the most outstanding occurrences of that mission is when Bible scriptures were being read during the end time of their flight. What an opportunity to speak the Word-of-God to all mankind on planet Earth.

But at the end of that infamous and famous year - there was the space launching of Apollo 8. That mission would generate a new historical data base of spacecraft information. It was not the first Apollo space mission but the first spacecraft mission to leave the low earth orbit; to reach the moon; to orbit the moon and return to earth.

Per research this mission was made to evaluate lunar distances while in the moons orbit space (cislunar). It would also measure crew performance during the lunar orbit. Additionally, it was to demonstrate communications tracking at lunar distances; to evaluate the command and service module performance. They also captured high resolution photos of the earth. This mission was in preparation of Apollo 11 that would land men on the moon.

In retrospect, the fulfilling of this space mission may have had its anxious moments but must be classified as rewarding. It appeared to be a privilege to all those who participated in this magnanimous aerospace effort. It was a great benefit to all of mankind.
